## Required Supplies

# What will I do to get there?

- Class will be conducted in Spanish at least 90% of the time. In order to learn to communicate in Spanish, you must listen, read, write, and speak in Spanish as much as possible.
- We will do our own work. This means we will not use online translators.
  Use www.wordreference.com
- The goal is to move forward in our proficiency. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to check <u>Profe</u> <u>Kat's DP</u> or ask her or a classmate about what you missed. Then, make it up as soon as possible.
  - We will have a supportive and positive learning environment where everyone helps each other to learn and grow.
- Cell phones are NOT allowed in class or in pockets and will be in students' backpacks or the phone tree. (unless otherwise directed by Profe Kat)



Course Description: This is a beginner course in Spanish language and culture. We will be learning through a method known as Comprehensible Input (CI). CI uses stories, novels, history, gestures, games and high-frequency vocabulary to acquire the language by using Spanish (as opposed to using English to talk about Spanish). Studies show that people acquire language by listening and reading, so we will be doing lots of this in the classroom. Students will work with partners and groups often, and much of the learning will take place in the classroom. Therefore, attendance and participation are extremely important.


#### **Español 1 Learning Targets**

<u>Listening and Reading:</u> I can recognize familiar words and phrases when I listen and read in Spanish.

Writing: I can write simple stories and present information about myself and familiar topics using memorized / practiced word and phrases.

**Speaking:** I can ask and answer questions on very familiar topics using memorized / practiced words and phrases in Spanish.







These grades are in the learning zone and reflect <u>work ethic</u>, <u>preparedness</u>, and <u>contribution</u>. Learning and participation grades might include in class tasks and homework, active contribution in class, self-assessment, reflections on learning and reading / writing / listening comprehension checks.

• 50 % = Performance Grades

Performance grades allow students to produce work that demonstrates <u>learning</u>, <u>skills</u> and <u>growth</u>. These tasks will include vocabulary quizzes, projects, presentations and reading / writing/listening comprehension assessments.

Outside Resources: Students must always do their own work for Spanish class. Unless otherwise directed, all work is designed to be completed by the student alone.



<u>Unapproved resources:</u> Internet translators, friends/relatives who speak Spanish, other students' work (Students caught using unapproved resources <u>will lose credit</u> and face penalties per school policy.)

Late Work: I only accept complete and neat assignments. You must communicate ahead of time if you will be absent and miss any due dates. All assignments. including late assignments, can demonstrate proficiency and earn up to a B, but only on-time assignments can earn exemplary or excelling status (A). Late assignments will lose 20% off the final grade. Re-takes or corrections of the tests or quizzes will be up to the discretion of the teacher as to whether they will be available.
