- Class will be conducted in Spanish at least $90 \%$ of the time. In order to learn to communicate in Spanish, you must listen, read, write, and speak in Spanish as much as possible.
- We will do our own work. This means we will not use online translators. Use www.wordreference.com
- The goal is to move forward in our proficiency. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to check Profe Kat's DP or ask her or a classmate about what you missed. Then, make it up as soon as possible.

We will have a supportive and positive learning environment where everyone helps each other to learn and grow.

- Cell phones are NOT allowed in class or in pockets and will be in students' backpacks placed by the wall. (unless otherwise directed by Profe Kat)

Course Description: This is a year long, upper-level Spanish course that requires successful completion of Spanish 2 to enroll. That said, most Spanish 3 students are still beginner level students first semester, and let's hope that by the time you leave, you are moving toward intermediate levels. To have the most success in this class, students should have both a solid foundation to build upon and an interest in using the language. In an effort to prepare students for future language study and authentic communication, we will spend time learning the language and learning about the language (i.e. expect some grammar!). Current research suggests that students learn language through input, which means we will be doing lots of reading and listening (mostly to yours truly), so it is critical that you attend classes regularly.

## Español 3 Learning Targets

Reading and Listening:I can read and listen to intermediate texts, stories and novels in present, past and future tenses.

Writing: I can write stories and present information about myself and familiar topics using a variety of vocabulary and verbs in present, past and future tenses.

Speaking: I can confidently give information about myself as well as about others; and and speak about informal topics in the present, past and future

## GRADES <br> - $50 \%=$ Learning and Participation



These grades are in the learning zone and reflect work ethic, preparedness, and contribution.
Learning and participation grades might include binder checks, active contribution in class, self-assessment, reflections on learning and reading / writing / listening comprehension checks.

## - 50 \% = Performance Grades

Performance grades allow students to produce work that demonstrates learning, skills and growth. These tasks will include vocabulary quizzes, projects, presentations and reading / writing/ listening comprehension assessments.

Outside Resources: Students must always do their own work for Spanish class. Unless otherwise directed, all work is designed to be completed by the student alone.
Approved resources: textbook, dictionary, www.wordreference.com, notes/materials provided in class
Unapproved resources: Internet translators, friends/relatives who speak Spanish, other students' work (Students caught using unapproved resources will lose credit and face penalties per school policy.)

> Late Work: I only accept complete and neat assignments. You must communicate ahead of time if you will be absent and miss any due dates. All assignments. including late assignments, can demonstrate proficiency and earn up to a B, but only on-time assignments can earn exemplary or excelling status (A). Late assignments will lose $20 \%$ off the final grade. Re-takes or corrections of the tests or quizzes will be up to the discretion of the teacher as to whether they will be available.
